**Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order with prayer at 9:00AM by Moderator Rev. Deborah Kirk.

**Quorum**

Pursuant to BOO G-3.0304 the required number for a quorum in the presbytery is 3 ministers and 3 elders, provided that at least three churches are represented by elders. A quorum was determined.

**Docket**

After minor changes in the sequence of presentations, the docket with the minor changes was approved.

**Welcome by Hosts**

Rev. Jimmie Hawkins (Pastor, Covenant Presbyterian) welcomed the body to the 2<sup>nd</sup> oldest African American church in Durham. The church moved into the current facility in 2003 and Rev. Hawkins invited all commissioners to return on November 15, 2015 for a burning of the mortgage celebration! He announced that the offering taken during the morning worship would be given to the Lincoln Community Health Center.

**Introduction of First Time Commissioners**

Commissioners attending for the first time were introduced and welcomed. An orientation was provided for all commissioners prior to the opening of the meeting.

### **Black Caucus Report**

Elder Vedas Neale, Calvary Presbyterian, Wilson Elder Neale reported that grant money from the Jubilee Fund from the Synod of the Mid Atlantic was used for a two week music camp for 25 children, ages 6-16. Breakfast and lunch were served every day. 10 churches and 16 schools were represented. The closing performance on Friday was well received by all. This community choir will bless and serve others by performing at an assisted living facility each month through December.

ConnectEd is excited to host Bruce Reyes Chow for a workshop on *Technology to Teach and Reach* on September 19 via Skype at host churches in Goldsboro and Raleigh. All churches received flyers today and are encouraged to bring a group to either Goldsboro FPC or White Memorial in Raleigh. ConnectEd will continue to be a resource to help congregations filter through all of the resources and applications out there in order to Connect them with the best practices to enhance their ministries. Mary Todd demonstrated using the IMO App to contact Bill Buchanan, the Executive Director of Asheville Youth Mission and Raleigh Youth Mission. Bill explained how he relies heavily on technology to communicate with staff in different sites: teleconferences, texting, and other social media are used to support one another and share what is going on.

-The Board of Pensions Call to Health Initiative. In 2014, 45.2% of Board of Pensions plan members in New Hope completed the Call to Health. This compares to 43.4% of plan members nationwide. This year the Board is setting a goal of 50% or more. This is a reminder that when you complete the Call to Health, which includes a physical, no later than September 30<sup>th</sup>, you will save on your 2016 deductible.

-A number of churches are still on the outstanding to be reviewed Sessional records list.

Whether you forgot to attend your cluster group or did not receive info about the cluster gatherings, these records need to be reviewed. We will give everyone an opportunity to get on the Approved list at the October presbytery meeting. A large team will examine the minutes during the meeting. In late September or early October, Clerks of Sessions will receive correspondence reminding them to bring their minutes to the meeting.
