Our churches have a shared vision in Christ's love through study, worship. music, service and action. Within our communities we participate in Souls (Feeding Ministry), Tai Chi, Paint Pals, Book Club, SPCA, Presbyterian Women and Blessing Box. In the Edenton community we have prayer blankets, birthday kits, food bank, recycling projects, Presbyterian Women, and Bandor and Bhaaloo (Female education in India). Many volunteers are not members of our Churches signifying our ideals of inclusion, that God welcomes every person unconditionally, and we believe it is important to extend that same embracing welcome to everyone.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

Nestled along the waters of the Albemarle Sound, Elizabeth City and Edenton embody the charm and resilience of coastal North Carolina, where history whispers through centuries-old oak trees and brick lined streets. Elizabeth City, (Harbor of Hospitality) hums with the energy of a waterfront town, where boats bob along the Pasquotank River and neighbors greet each other like family. Just down the road,

Edenton stands as a picturesque gem, its stately homes and white steeple churches reflecting the grace of a town deeply rooted in tradition. In both communities, faith weaves through daily life, and in the heart of each historic downtown, two churches stand as beacons of worship, service, and enduring community spirit. Our mission, as stated in #1, provides opportunities for many as we continue to engage in activities, and are open to any needs and/or ideas that arise.

How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

Cann and First Presbyterian in 2024 laid the foundation as a yoked ministry. We are seeking enthusiastic leadership to continue to strengthen, nurture and guide our congregations along with our sessions. Our desire would be for a minister with a vision for our yoked ministry which needs not only to survive but thrive.

The candidate would preach two Sundays in Elizabeth City and two Sundays in Edenton. The 5th Sunday would be determined by the Worship Committee. The video Sunday's scripture and sermon would be recorded midweek and viewed on our newly installed equipment. The rest of the Service would be conducted by lay readers. Office hours are shared with visitation, counseling, etc. as needed.

We find comfort in a traditional worship format with the intellectual stimulation and challenge of scripture based teaching of biblical history and its relationship to our present-day trials. They will also build relationships with local clergy and non-profits, helping us extend God's love through outreach and service.

Christian education is central to our faith journey, and we seek a pastor who will support discipleship. They will work with Session to develop new ministries, while dreaming boldly for the future. Leadership will be approached with a sense of purpose, ensuring that our resources align with our mission to serve God and neighbor. In all these responsibilities, we pray for a pastor who will lead with humility, energy, and trust in God's providence. Together, we will grow in faith, serve with joy, and embrace the ministry God has set before us.
